2014 - 2015 CRCPD/SCATR Source Collection and Disposal Opportunity

The Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors (CRCPD) Source Collection and Threat Reduction (SCATR) program provides cost-share support for the collection and commercial disposal of Class A, B, and C disused and unwanted radioactive sealed sources. SCATR is funded through a grant provided by the Department of Energy (DOE) National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA). Cost-share amounts generally include collection, packaging, transport, and disposal.

The 2014 -2015 Nationwide SCATR Collection will provide cost-share support of 45% for the collection and commercial disposal of eligible sources. Licensees in all 50 States and U.S. territories are eligible for participation in this effort. To be considered for participation, licensees must register their disused and unwanted sources with the Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) Off-Site Source Recovery Project (OSRP) at:

Interested licensees are encouraged to register their disused and unwanted sources as soon as possible to facilitate participation in this effort. ² CRCPD will begin contacting registered licensees for participation in the effort in **October 2014:**

- Currently registered sources will automatically be considered for program participation. However, generators are encouraged to verify online that their registered source inventory and contact information is up to date;
- While CRCPD/SCATR sets source collection and cost-share targets on an annual basis, both are subject to funding and other limitations. CRCPD/SCATR expects future costshare amounts to decrease on a regular basis.
