

IAEA CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENT AUTHORITY

This certifies that the source described has been demonstrated to meet the regulatory requirements for special form radioactive material as prescribed in the regulations of the International Atomic Energy Agency¹ and the United States of America² for the transport of radioactive materials.

1. Source Identification - General Electric Standard Teletherapy Source.
2. Source Description - The source is a double encapsulation constructed of 304 stainless steel with tungsten inert gas welded closures. Outside dimensions are 37.1mm (1.46") in length and between 13.4 (0.53") and 33.4 mm (1.32") in diameter. The capsules are constructed in accordance with GE Drawing No. 106C3912 (attached).
3. Radioactive Contents - Not more than 740 TBq (20,000 Ci) of Cobalt-60 as metal pellets.
4. Quality Assurance - Records of Quality Assurance activities required by Paragraph 209 of the IAEA regulations¹ shall be maintained and made available to the authorized officials for at least three years after the last shipment authorized by this certificate. Consignors and consignees in the United States exporting or importing shipments under this certificate shall satisfy the requirements of Subpart H of 10 CFR 71.
5. Expiration Date - This certificate expires May 31, 2004.

This certificate is issued in accordance with paragraph 703 of the IAEA Regulations and Section 173.476 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, in response to the petition and information dated December 3, 1998 submitted by General Electric Co., Sunol, CA, and in consideration of other information on file in this Office.
